Course description – Thursday, January 19

Advancement in THA Techniques

The hip course will focus on the advancement of surgical techniques in primary and revision hips. More advanced applications of the Direct Anterior approach along with other primary approaches to THA will be taught. The attendee will learn how to expand indications to include revision hips in their practice with didactic presentations and cadaver labs to include REDAPT® Revision Femoral and Acetabular products. Also, the changing healthcare environment will be highlighted as attendees learn how to manage bundled payments, pain management and various other technologies. In the primary hip lab, the Direct Anterior and the modified antero-lateral approaches will be featured along with ANTHOLOGY®, POLARSTEM®, R3® and VERILAST® technologies. REDAPT Revision Femoral and Acetabular will be featured in the revision labs.
